FROM THE ROAD COMMISSIONER

FALL LEAF PICK UP:

- Leaves to be collected should be gathered into a pile in the grass area next to the road edge.
- DO NOT PILE LEAVES IN THE ROAD
- DO NOT MIX GRASS & TWIGS & BRANCHES with leaves to be collected.
- Weekly fall leaf pick-up begins Monday, October 17th and ends Friday, December 16th this year.
- Please refrain from mowing your grass onto the roadways. Storm water collects the grass and it accumulates around catch basins, causing poor drainage.

TREE LIMBS, BRANCHES, TWIGS AND VINES:

- Pick-up of larger branches and limbs (over 1-inch in diameter) will be chipped on the **SECOND** and **FOURTH** week of the month. (Friday and/or Saturday)
- Any trees or shrubs that are cut down, must be completely removed at the property owner's expense. Residents can contact Gareth Schul at 440-221-8586 for assistance.
- Vines must be tied and bundled for easy pick-up.
