

ORDINANCE NO. 17-06

AN ORDINANCE REVISING THE VILLAGE'S FARMLAND PRESERVATION PROGRAM GUIDELINES AND SELECTION CONSIDERATIONS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Village adopted Farmland Preservation Program Guidelines and Selection Considerations pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. 15-10; and

WHEREAS, the Village desires to amend the provisions of said Program Guidelines and Selection Considerations to better serve the residents of the Village.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE OF NORTH PERRY, COUNTY OF LAKE, STATE OF OHIO, as follows:

Section 1. The Village Farmland Preservation Program Guidelines and Selection Considerations established pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. 15-10 are amended. Exhibit A attached hereto is hereby adopted as Farmland Preservation Program Guidelines and Selection Considerations for North Perry Village.

Section 2. The severability provisions of the Codified Ordinances Section 101.08 shall be applicable to this Ordinance.

Section 3. That all formal actions of this Council concerning the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting, and all deliberations of this Council, or any of its committees, which result in formal actions, were in meeting open to the public, in compliance with all requirements included in Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Village of North Perry, and for the further reasons set forth in the preamble herein above. Therefore, this ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage.
