

ORDINANCE NO. R17-04

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AN INCREASE IN THE SPENDING LIMIT OF THE PARK SUPERVISORS TO EXPEND UP TO TWO THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$2,500) EACH, PER PURCHASE, FOR THE CONTINUATION OF THE NEEDS AND SERVICES OF THE VILLAGE OF NORTH PERRY AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Village of North Perry requires certain purchases to maintain and continue certain services for the preservation and continuation of the business of the Village of North Perry; and

WHEREAS, said purchases necessitate an increase in the spending limit of the Park Supervisors to Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500) each per purchase.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF NORTH PERRY, COUNTY OF LAKE AND STATE OF OHIO, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That the Park Supervisors are is authorized to expend up to Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500) each per purchase for the continuation of the Village needs and services.

SECTION 2. That all formal actions of this Council concerning the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting, and all deliberations of this Council, or any of its Committees, which resulted in such formal actions, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be and is passed as an emergency Ordinance, the emergency being the immediate necessity to increase the spending limits of the Park Supervisors. Said Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the Village of North Perry.

WHEREFORE, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by Council.
