

RESOLUTION NO. R16-23

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR AND THE FISCAL OFFICER TO ENTER INTO A FOUR-YEAR CONTRACT WITH WASTE MANAGEMENT FOR CURB-SIDE GARBAGE AND RUBBISH REMOVAL SERVICES FOR THE VILLAGE AND ITS RESIDENTS and DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Village has solicited bids to provide for curb-side garbage and rubbish removal services for the Village and for its residents; and

WHEREAS, the Village has accepted the bid from Waste Management for said services for a four-year term, at the rates quoted therein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF NORTH PERRY, COUNTY OF LAKE AND STATE OF OHIO, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That the Mayor and the Fiscal Officer are hereby authorized to enter into a four-year contract with Waste Management for curb-side garbage and rubbish removal for the Village and the residents of the Village pursuant to the terms of Exhibit A, attached hereto.

SECTION 2. That all formal actions of this Council concerning the passage of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting, and all deliberations of this Council, or any of its Committees, which resulted in such formal actions, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. This Resolution is hereby declared to be and is passed as an emergency Resolution, the emergency being the necessity to enter into the contract so there will be no disruption of services to the residents. Said Resolution is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the Village of North Perry.

WHEREFORE, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by Council.
