

**ORDINANCE NO. 14-05**

**ORDINANCE ADOPTING PERMANENT APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE YEAR 2014 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

**WHEREAS**, the Village of North Perry has adopted temporary appropriations for the calendar year 2014 and now in accordance with law must adopt and approve permanent appropriations for 2014.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY COUNCIL FOR THE VILLAGE OF NORTH PERRY, COUNTY OF LAKE AND STATE OF OHIO AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section 1:** That the Fiscal Officer of the Village of North Perry is hereby authorized and directed to appropriate on a permanent basis the following sums of money for the purpose of providing services and benefits to the residents of the Village of North Perry:

General Fund	\$ 5,829,057.50
Street Construction, Maintenance and Repair Fund	581,705.00
Capital Projects	1,385,000.00
Bond Retirement Fund	666,912.50
Equipment Replacement Fund	25,000.00
Trust and Agency Fund	<u>6,000.00</u>
 TOTAL	 \$ 8,493,675.00

**Section 2:** That all formal actions of this Council concerning the passage of this Ordinance were adopted at an open meeting, and all deliberations of this Council, or any of its committees, which resulted in such formal actions, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

**Section 3:** This Ordinance is hereby declared to be and is passed as an emergency measure, the emergency being the need to submit appropriations to County Auditor in a timely manner. Said Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the Village of North Perry.

**Section 4:** This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force upon its passage by Council.
